

#### Minutes of the Qld Management Committee Meeting 1 September 2016

#### Wandoan Polocrosse Grounds

State Champs: a wet weekend is forecast but whatever happens the State Champs will go ahead. Under-age drinking at carnivals; noted that this will not be tolerated and will be heavily policed at Wandoan State Champs.

Discussion re the Junior & Intermediate Trials set down for Wandoan. These have to go ahead as it was a motion passed at the 2015 AGM. This motion should have been for every second year (Nationals years). Selectors will organise teams and co-ordinate the Wandoan trials, Charlie will oversee this. The notion of trials and when they should be held during the year will be revisited at the 2016 AGM.

The camps are to include intermediates and subjuniors.

As motions come in from Clubs & Zones MC members to work with the Clubs putting the motion to ensure they are properly crafted before being tabled at the AGM.



Noted that the ASHS will give the QPA five rugs to be awarded at the annual awards. Invite the ASHA representative in the Rockhampton region.

Rockhampton AGM to start at 9.00am registration from 8.30am.

Justin noted that Kim & John McMaster (Gold Coast) wish to donate three bridles to be awarded to three members who have gone above and beyond the call of duty in assisting sub juniors, to be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner. To be given in "recognition of services for the development of mini-juniors."

Charlie to check through the AGM Documents pack to be sent out to all clubs following this meeting. Include a note that the QPA is striving to increase female representation on the QPA Management Committee.

Ensure that it is clear on the awards nomination form that Clubs may nominate more than one member for any award.

#### **Player Gradings**

Player gradings require review from a state perspective again. Justin suggested that the South East Zone lead this push and then match up to the other zones. Penny & Tex to oversee the Cap Zone, Kim & James to do Leichardt and help Outback and Central West. Lou to review the Far North. MC to pool all gradings on the Friday night prior to the next MC Meeting (15 October) to provide an annual bench mark.

Meeting to be held after play on Saturday to ratify the 2017 calendar. Note that Townsville have dropped one weekend down so as not to clash with Calliope.

Tara to host the intermediate carnival again in 2017.

Capella given permission to host a women's comp in conjunction with their carnival if they wish, may run a chukka comp for opens in conjunction with this.

Jnr & inter trial to be two weeks after the State Champs if they continue.

A junior coaching clinic will be held the Friday before Bauhinia in 2017, may combine the trials into this.

Gillian to speak with PAWA re securing a suitable camping are and headquarters for the WA Nationals.

### **STATE DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING REPORT - 31 AUGUST 2016**

With the club carnivals now finished, I am pleased to say that the Warwick carnival ended the domestic season on a very good note. The carnival ran twelve rounds on Saturday and not at any stage were we waiting for an umpire. At the Gold Coast carnival an incident occurred which resulted in two players receiving a one carnival suspension. The incident was thoroughly investigated and I am confident that the umpiring committee made the right decision. These decisions aren't made lightly, as we don't like stopping people from playing but we can't have players acting in this way on the field.

The **three free goal rule** has been put to work a few times lately. Some for minor indiscretions but I think this rule is starting to change players behaviour in the way they act on the field. A couple of players have been sent to the sideline for poor behaviour (mainly swings) and it is good to see umpires doing this.

I have gone through the playing list for Wondoan and out of 66 open teams there are 27 teams that have one or no umpires within the team. This means for the whole carnival we can only draw umpires from 40 teams out of 77 including the juniors. Out of those 27 teams we only have 17 umpires from 162 players. We need to get the message back to clubs that players **NEED** to be umpires. Penny is trying to encourage more women to become umpires through the **Womens Committee**, so good luck Penny.

I am trying to organize an umpire school sometime in October, possibly in Toowoomba but nothing fully organized yet.

## State Administrator's Report - Management Committee Meeting Wednesday 1 September 2016

#### Department of Sport & Rec. Funding Round

I'm pleased to report that following submission of Part A the QPA have remained in the \$50-100k p.a. funding band, Part B of the application is due 15 September and a draft is currently with our client Liaison Luke Carmen.

#### New national database - SportsTG Database Demo.

I sat with Rodney & Lea-anne Geppert through a demonstration from the above company on a sports membership database and I've passed back my comments to Christine Franklin and Rodney. I've not been privy to any of the discussion regarding the contract with the current database developers or the costing on the proposed database but my comments are as follows:

These are my thoughts following the database demo from SportsTG today, keeping in mind I have no idea about costings, please share these if you think it will help.

#### Big plusses:

The ability to communicate directly with members and constructed member groups and to have a record of this communication.

The ability to pay for everything online, memberships of all types, merchandise, entry fees etc. using direct debit or credit card.

#### Downside:

There is much in this database that polocrosse will not make use of.

No ability to link horses or horse movements.

Very inflexible, we are accustomed to a highly tailored piece of software and this is a long way from that, I get the feeling tailoring in any way is not on, or simply cost prohibitive.

I do think that there will be a large attrition of Club Secretaries and Registrars if and when a new database is bought in.

I must admit I'm of the opinion that fixing the current system, if this is possible, by adding membership communication and improved payment options, would work well.

More importantly an effective communication campaign to all members to get them using the database themselves, rather than leaving it to Club Secs and Registrars, will in the long term improve the veracity of polocrosse's data collection.

# <u>Horse Welfare Report – 31 August 2016</u> Queensland Horse Welfare Officer – Justin Hafey

I would like to submit my Horse Welfare Report to date as follows.

An area that has come under attack lately is the hitting of horses with rackets by opposing players when swinging. To discuss this concern, I have been in contact with State Chief Umpire Paul McGrath who was also aware of this creeping into the game. The matter will be addressed at Wandoan State Championships at a meeting prior to play commencing. Instructions will be given to Umpires that this offence will be treated the same as hitting a person with a racket and will result in a free goal and if deemed more severe, there will be a possibility of the player being sent off for a period of time.

I have been in touch with other Zones outside of South East Queensland; the majority of their carnivals seem to have been running quite smoothly throughout the year. There was an issue with the Bauhinia fields, the matter has been addressed and by all accounts the fields will be in an acceptable playing state for the Queensland Zone Titles. Another issue has come to my attention – some clubs have not had Horse Floats/Tarps readily available for on field incidents. A reminder will be forwarded to all Clubs of the correct Horse Welfare Protocol that needs to be in place when hosting a carnival.

This year in our biggest Zone – South East Queensland, we have hosted 11 Carnivals for 81 horses vetted out; an average of 7 horses per carnival. The majority of these horses were vetted out in the early part of the season with possible inadequate horse preparation being a major factor. I believe this indicates a need to run more Multi Horse Carnivals at the beginning of the season rather than later as this would allow more time and options for the preparation of horses match fitness.

Finally, I would like to make a special mention and thank Tex Kerr for the extra work that he does with Horse Welfare in the Capricornia Zone, it is greatly appreciated.
